# **Headline News**

An updated <u>Working together to safeguard children</u> was published in December 2023. This is statutory guidance on multi-agency working to help, protect and promote the welfare of children. The NSPCC has pulled together a useful <u>summary of the changes</u> and the MSCP has begun exploring what this means for the partnership locally, including via the Full Partnership in early February.

Alongside this, the Department for Education has published the new <u>Children's social care: national framework</u> - statutory guidance on the principles behind children's social care, its purpose, factors enabling good practice and what it should achieve.

## Merton Joint Targeted Area Inspection (JTAI) - published findings

A message from Jane McSherry, MSCP Executive Member and Executive Director for Children, Lifelong Learning & Families at LB of Merton, regarding the recent JTAI inspection:

"We are pleased they recognised that "Most vulnerable children in Merton affected by serious youth violence and/or criminal exploitation benefit from effective strategically aligned and integrated partnership arrangements" and that partners in Merton "respond swiftly together to ameliorate emerging risks to children in local communities".

There are lots of examples of brilliant practice across the partnership outlined in the report, so please do give it a full read. It can be accessed here: Merton JTAI findings

As shared during the inspection, a few areas for improvement were identified. In response, the inspectorates have requested a multi-agency written statement of proposed action. The Merton Safeguarding Children Partnership has been determined as the lead for this and will be working to finalise this in the upcoming weeks before the deadline of 23 May 2024. #### **Independent Scrutiny Update**

Our scrutineers support and challenge the local safeguarding partners in Merton to ensure that children are kept as safe as possible, and their wellbeing is promoted. One of the ways they do that is by carrying out scrutiny of key safeguarding themes that are of concern to the MSCP (Merton Safeguarding Children Partnership) and the community.

The current theme is investigating **neglect of children and young people** within safeguarding practice, specifically to look at current practice, what national learning there has been and to identify recommendations for future work. Please do keep a look out for invites to roundtable discussions and opportunities for children to participate in focus groups.

# **Private Fostering Awareness Campaign**

The London Borough of Merton has a legal duty to ensure that any child or young person is safe, well looked after and does not come to any harm in a private fostering arrangement, by making sure that he/she and their carer are visited regularly and offered advice and guidance when needed.

The HMICFRS has published the recent inspection of the London Metropolitan Police Service with recommendations to improving service delivery under the theme of sexual and criminal exploitation of children in London. The MSCP will be supporting the South West Basic Command Unit to respond to the identified learning.


# **Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel Annual Report**

The independent annual <u>report</u> for serious child safeguarding incidents, 2022 to 2023 was published at the end of January. The report reflects in some depth on six key themes:

- Effective leadership and culture supporting critical thinking and professional challenge.
- Giving central consideration to racial, ethnic, and cultural identity and the impact on the lived experiences of children and families
- The importance of a whole family approach to risk assessment and support
- · Recognising and responding to the vulnerability of babies
- Domestic abuse and harm to children
- Keeping a focus on risks outside the family

# Boys, Childhood Domestic Abuse, and Gang Involvement Briefing

Bristol University has released a fascinating policy briefing based on the book "Boys, Childhood Domestic Abuse, and Gang Involvement" by Author Dr Jade Levell, a senior lecturer in criminology at the University of Bristol and part of the Gender and Violence Research Centre. The briefing includes some policy recommendations to be considered. Dr Levell also published this interesting Blog on her website just last month focusing on her thoughts on codependency in the context of childhood DVA.
